#### **ALIVE Youth Group**

At this month's ALIVE Youth Group meeting, the OutCenter will be showing footage from filmmaker Alden Peters' film-in-progress, "Coming Out," from 2-4 p.m. on July 20 at the Phoenix.



Shocked by the LGBTQ suicides in 2010, filmmaker Peters teamed

up with Brenda Lopez, Patrick Murphy, Alex Familian, and Megan Mancini to create a documentary that captures the coming out process in today's social media driven society. Alden



turned on the cameras and got his family's, friends', and acquaintances'reactions to him revealing his identity as an LGBTQ community member.

Alden was born and raised in Seattle and attended New York University's Tisch School of the Arts as a filmmaker. He struggled with his identity and, like many others, looked to the internet for help. The thought of coming out terrified him so he looked up stories on YouTube.

"They were interesting but they were essentially, 'This happened two years ago, then this happened, now it's like this,'" Peters said. "I just couldn't wrap my head around what it was actually like to come out. I wanted to see it. That went into the decision to film it."

His idea to make his experience into a documentary was fueled by his adolescence, in which he was never assured that homosexuality was socially accepted. He hopes that the documentary will assure today's youth that it is, essentially, okay to be gay.

"We want to encourage LGBTQ youth to be proud of who they are, and positive stories foster that courage and pride," Peters said.

As pride goes, Peters' story is one of hope for the entire community. Not only does it offer an inside look at what coming out can look like, it also deals with growing up feeling different and addressing those feelings of otherness.

"Everyone will have a different experience of course, but I know there is a need for some sort of example," Peters said. "A starting point. That's what this film is intended to be. I hope a young LGBTQ boy or girl can watch this film and feel supported and inspired to be who they are."

This screening is for 14-21 year old LGBT youth and their allies.

After the screening, people are invited to share and listen to others share their stories and experiences of coming out.

Heather emphasized to all in attendance how important it is for us all speak up and speak out, telling our stories and letting all know how important it is--how just it is--for LGBT people to be fully equal in the U.S.
